Anaesthesia for patients taking antipsychotic drugs Antipsychotic medication should be continued perioperatively, as abrupt withdrawal may result in recurrence of psychotic symptoms It may also increase the incidence of postoperative confusion, which is high in those suffering with schizophrenia Antipsychotic drugs potentiate the hypotensive and
