#### **Children’s reasoning about distributive and retributive ...**

Developmental studies of distributive justice Piaget (1932/1965) discussed the distinction between a preference for equality (everyone gets the same amount) versus a preference for equity (each party gets what he or she needs or deserves) Piaget found that equality preferences did not give way to equity preferences until age 9 or later
