The challenge of protecting boys from sexual abuse

Briggs and Hawkins (1990, 1994a, 1994b, 1996a, 1996b) found that the Protective Behaviours Program was seriously flawed as a tool for preventing and stopping child sexual abuse, especially the abuse of boys In interviews with 198 male victims of abuse (1994), 43% revealed that they liked some aspect of the sexual experience They enjoyed
