Nutrition and Hydration at the End of Life

Options for nutrition and hydration should first consider what is physiologically possible Based on options developed with an accurate understanding of the patient's disease processes, the patient's (or surrogate's) values can be elicited Decisions to provide food and fluid at

Hydration What it is: Nutrition is about the intake of food and how this maintains health of the body Hydration is the intake of fluids to maintain health Why it matters: Food and fluids are necessary to support life and promote healing In the early stages of palliative care, nutritional intervention

Nutrition Dilemmas for Palliative Care And Hospice Patients

- Artificial Nutrition: non -oral, enteral or parenteral delivery of nutrients-Includes NG, PEG, PEG -J or GJ tubes; PIV or CV access-Goal is to provide nourishment for patients in whom life expectancy or quality of life is expected to improve
- Artificial Hydration: delivery of fluids by any route other than oral-
